Welcome to our first newsletter of the year. You should all have your 2019 schedules by now. Please let me know what you think of our updated version. As usual this update has not appeared by magic. You will see from the Show Schedule that there is a 'full programme' for 2019 and Rose Mortenson and Neil McNamara have organised seven Outings to a number of destinations - see pages 6 to 9.

The committee has been working hard to encourage more members to join. We will once again be having a recruitment stall on village day. It was very successful last year. Those of you who have access to our website will notice that our membership form has been updated with our bank details so that anyone who has online banking can now pay their subscription direct into to our bank account. Please be assured that you will still be able to pay by cheque or cash.

Now I come to my usual request for help at various events. Firstly, I would like to thank the members who contacted me offering their help when needed. However, **we still need a Treasurer** to replace Michael Elliott who is still handling the accounts for us. Members of the committee are helping with his jobs such as banking. It is not an ideal system but, for now, we have no choice.

Next year we will need a Catering Supervisor: There are 3 coffee mornings and 3 Shows during the year. Coffee mornings only involve tea or coffee and biscuits. For the 3 Shows the biscuits are replaced by cakes. Apart from purchasing the tea etc. you need to organise helpers for each event and cake makers for the Shows. I know Debbie Anscombe has a list of helpers and cake makers. If you are interested and want more information please speak to Debbie or me. Our contact details are in the Show Schedule. Perhaps there are two friends that could take on the job between them.

Also, we are looking for a Show Secretary: You need to book all the judges for the 3 Shows. For each Show you input the entries in the laptop and print the entry cards. During the Friday evening before each Show, spaces for the entries are set out on tables in the Newcombe Hall of the King Edward Hall. The Saturday of the Show you can accept late entries and, if need be, help exhibitors with entries. You welcome the judges on arrival. Judging starts at 10.30am. When the judging has finished you need to collate all the results and work out the cup winners. There is a Show Superintendent to help you on the Friday evening and on Saturday. Again, if you are interested, please contact me or our current Show Secretary, Deborah Novotny. Contact details are in the Show Schedule. Perhaps a couple or a group of friends might be interested in taking on this job.

If someone was to come forward now for these jobs he/she could work with the current Catering Supervisor>Show Secretary for this year and learn hands on. Also, remember that if you are willing to take on these roles in the LHS you are not alone as we have a brilliant committee who are invariably around at coffee mornings and the Shows to help.

A VIEW FROM THE SHED

This time last year I was wishing you a Happy New Year, asking you to come and buy some Strulch and advising you to get your sweet peas planted. What I love about gardening is that you always have new things to learn. I always soaked my sweet peas, and got very good germination rates but I grow some Orange varieties (don't ask) and apparently you should NEVER soak them as they rot! They weren't wrong; I got a whole packet to germinate without any fails.

I also bunged in a load of seeds a few Autumns' ago and they thrived (despite the snow) and I concluded that sweet peas were hardy and no problem to overwinter. Is a little knowledge a dangerous thing I now ask myself? For example, I didn't realise that there are some specific Winter Varieties of Sweet peas that (basically) flower early. The clue is in the name of varieties like Winter Sunshine..... and then Spring Sunshine, or is that just a ruse to get us to buy more? You live and learn.

Shed Opening Times

Anyway, it's still a good time to plant these little beauties and we're still selling roottrainers and lots of other goodies. You will no doubt know that the Sundries Centre (aka The Shed) is next open on 10th March which is a Sunday, not a Saturday - see 'Corrections' - below. The great news is that Spring Lane is going to have lots of the pot holes fixed, but the bad news is that earlier this year, there was too much rain to complete the job. Despite this, our first day of opening was successful and it was lovely to see those who came, including a new member.

We'll continue to open as normal but we haven't been able to get any new deliveries, as the pile of 'material' being used to fix the lane would impede a delivery. In the meantime, we'll be operating off last year's price list for now so bear with us and come and bag a bargain before the prices go up. We'll be pleased to see you.

Volunteers

I didn't get any volunteers for my horsetail test (I'm amazed I'm the only one that has this stuff, or are you all shy) but ever the optimist, I'd like to have a look at seed composts. I'm currently sourcing some smaller bales of Peat so people can actually lift them. We have some coir bales which haven't been popular but I'd like to run some trials of various options versus Peat. If you're interested, please contact me to join in.

Organic versus non-organic

I'm not evangelistic about 'chemical' as opposed to 'natural' or 'organic' versus 'non-organic' as the ideal in my view is some sort of balance. On that basis, I am happy to supply alternatives so you, as the customer, can choose. What I am aiming to do though is to spread knowledge and to keep you all as informed as much as possible. So to finish, Valentine's day is always a good day to remember to do a couple of tasks. The first is to cut back your roses and the second is to start your slug treatment. I used to use Slugit which has been withdrawn from the market, but you can use Ammonia (1 part : 9 parts water dilution) drenched round the plants before they come into leaf or we're going to stock a homemade garlic wash or alternatively Grazers. Whichever you try, you need constant vigilance and re-application..... (Gill Jones)

Note from the Sundries Centre

With so much in the news about single-use plastics and the merits of repurposing, we at the Sundries Centre thought that together with your help we could try to do our bit towards saving the planet. Wednesday 1st May - Hole Park and Scotney Castle

Hole Park is famous for its bluebells and we are hoping, weather permitting, to be visiting at the height of its glory. This lovely 16 acre garden has wonderful formal areas with immaculate lawns, specimen trees and extensive topiary, a walled garden, pond, meadow as well as the bluebell woodland areas to explore. Disabled access is good and there is a picnic area, gift shop and plant stall. Tea/coffee and cake has been booked on arrival and is included in the fee. Members of the Historic Houses Association (HHA) will have free entry.

In the afternoon we will visit Scotney Castle. This is a National Trust property dating back to 1137. The house itself is fascinating and there are also the ruins or the original castle to explore. The gardens have many azaleas and rhododendrons and more bluebells so I hope there will also be plenty of colour here. We will be there in time for you to join a free, volunteer guided tour of the gardens if desired. NT members will have free entry to both house and garden whilst non-members can choose between house and garden or garden only entry.

Both venues have tea rooms, disabled access and wheelchairs

Thursday 6th June - Hardy's Cottage Plants & Whitchurch Silk Mill OR Laverstoke Mill

We are going to do a double visit with twist of lemon!!!

In the morning we will all visit Hardy's Cottage Plants. On arrival we shall be given tea or coffee prior to being shown around their propagation workshop and other parts of their nursery. There will be plenty of opportunity to buy plants! We will then move on to either:

Laverstoke Mill - now the home of the Bombay Sapphire Gin Distillery, was once a paper mill pioneering the watermark process in the 1700s supplying the Bank of England and the British Empire with Bank Note paper until 1963. Our visit will be a self-discovery experience, culminating in The Mill Bar where you will receive a drink, (non alcoholic if preferred) "on the house". The mill is in a great setting and has been converted to its present use sympathetically with a very modern twist. The catering facility is new this year and offers a good range for lunch or afternoon tea.

Please note Laverstoke Mill is a working distillery so they insist that guests wear suitable footwear. **Please do not wear open-toed shoes or high heels as you will not be admitted.**

OR

Whitchurch Silk Mill, the oldest working silk mill in the UK still in its original building. A gem of industrial heritage in beautiful rural Hampshire by the River Test. The Georgian water mill still weaves silk using 19th century machinery. It was extensively refurbished last year and there is a shop and a café on site which offers light lunches and cakes.

Friday 12th July - Leonardslee Gardens

Leonardslee has been closed to the public for the last 9 years and now, under new ownership, it is re-opening in March this year. For those who knew it in the past this will be a long-awaited opportunity to see how the garden has been restored and developed. For those who have never had the chance to see it, this is a beautiful 200 acre estate. It is a Grade I listed garden with wonderful planting, lakes, a rock garden and plenty of wildlife. There is a new café, a gift and farm shop and a Vineyard. As this is a local garden, people are welcome to drive themselves and, if possible, offer lifts to others. However, I am happy organise a minibus or small coach if there is the demand with the cost being dependent on numbers. The entry fee will be £9.50.

We are being offered an exclusive visit to this lovely private garden with proceeds going to local charities. This is a 12 acre garden with so much to see: mature and specimen trees, a formal parterre, rose and herb gardens, a huge terrace and herbaceous border. There is a cut turf labyrinth, forsythia tunnel, water features, statues, a lake with a temple on a small island the list goes on! The pathways are gravel and there are some slopes but generally access is good and by the time we have fully explored, we will be ready for our tea and cake.

There is parking for up to 14 cars and roadside parking in the village, but we will try and arrange shared lifts to minimise the number of vehicles.

Fee is £10 to include refreshments with all profits going to charity.

So we will be seeing a new face to this great garden. We are visiting when the RHS Flower Show will be running. This gives us the chance to explore all the delights of Wisley and visit the huge number of nursery and garden products stands, the National Dahlia Society Annual Show and exhibitions of Floral Artwork. This is going to be a full day!

As our Society is affiliated to the RHS, we get free entry so the fee for this outing, to include the coach travel and driver's tip, will be £14.75.

4. Tickets are initially only open to members of Lindfield Horticultural Society (LHS). If you have friends or family who would like to come on one or more of the outings, you are welcome to enclose a note giving me their names and I will put them on a waiting list for spare tickets.
5. This year I will send out ‘virtual’ tickets by email if you have provided an email address. If not, I will post tickets to you providing you enclose a self-addressed and stamped envelope with your application. If no envelope is provided, you can collect your ticket from me at any of the LHS events or from my house.
6. Tickets will show the departure and approximate return times. Coach pick up point is always the bus stop by the Lindfield Greengrocers.
7. Ticket price covers the coach travel, the driver’s tip and entry to the venues. Unless stated nothing else is included.
