



## Arrangements for LHS Plant Sales

### Introduction

At future Coffee Mornings, Flower Shows and on Village Day (Sat June 3<sup>rd</sup> 2023), the Society is planning to include a sale of plants grown by members. There are two main objectives: to raise funds for the Society; and to provide a service to members who like to grow plants and those who like to buy them.

All members are cordially invited to bring good quality plants to these events. There are two ways to do this, either as a **Donation** or with **Sale Proceeds Shared 75%/25%**.

### Donation

Ideally, we would like members to donate plants so that all the proceeds of the sale are retained by LHS. This will help the Society keep costs down and support services for members to enjoy.

If you are willing to donate plants, we would be most grateful. To do so, just bring them on the day, and if possible, include a label with the name of plant and add your own name if you wish. We will decide what price to charge.

### **Sale Proceeds Shared (75% to grower and 25% to LHS)**

We know some members grow a lot of plants and a few donate the money raised to registered charities or other good causes. The Society wants to encourage such members to sell plants at our events with 75% of proceeds going to the grower and 25% being retained by the Society.

If you wish to receive 75% of the proceeds raised, please use the following procedure:

- Growers wishing to sell plants on this basis are requested to contact us in advance by sending an e-mail with their name to **plantsales@lindfieldhorts.org.uk**
- The grower **must** include a label in each pot/container with their name and the price they want to charge
- When plants are sold, the Society will collect the payment in cash or by card payment and will remove and retain the price label. The label forms a record of the sale
- After the end of the event, the Society will pay the grower 75% of the proceeds collected – either in cash on the day or by bank transfer shortly after
- As with donated plants, we suggest you also include a separate label with the name of the plant – this will be left in the pot so the buyer knows what the plant is
