

Arrangements for LHS Plant Sales



Our plant table has become a regular feature at Coffee Mornings, Flower Shows and Village Day, and has proved to be very popular with visitors buying plants. In recent years we have raised around £1,000 each year for the Society with members donating a further £1,500 to local charities – a great achievement, and our thanks goes to members who grew the plants and the visitors who bought them.

All members are cordially invited to bring good quality plants to these events. There are two ways to do this, either as a donation to the Society or with sale proceeds shared 75%/25% to the grower and the Society.

Donation

Ideally, we would like members to donate plants so that all the proceeds of the sale are retained by LHS. This will help the Society keep costs down and support services for members to enjoy. If you are willing to donate plants, we would be most grateful. To do so, just bring them on the day, and if possible, include a label with the name of plant and add your own name if you wish. We will decide what price to charge

Sale Proceeds Shared (75% to grower and 25% to LHS)

We know some members like to grow plants to sell and retain most of the proceeds for themselves (some growers decide to donate what they receive to good causes). If you wish to sell on this basis and receive 75% of the proceeds raised, please use the following procedure:

- If possible, please contact us in advance by sending an e-mail with their name to plantsales@lindfieldhorts.org.uk
- Include a label in each pot/container with your name and the price you want to charge
- When plants are sold, the Society will collect the payment in cash or by card payment and will remove and retain the price label. The label forms a record of the sale
- After the end of the event, the Society will pay the grower 75% of the proceeds collected – either in cash on the day or by bank transfer shortly after
- As with donated plants, we suggest you also include a separate label with the name of the plant – this will be left in the pot so the buyer knows what the plant is
